

Best practices for designing utterances



Use real world data as your source for building utterances

- Augment, clean and refine your utterances
- Always be willing to refactor as you include more and more intents and utterances

Golden rules for utterances

- Quality over quantity
 - Generally speaking 30-40 to start off with, a minimum of 80 for production
- 80/20 split train/test your model
- Test early and prove your design is viable

Best practices for designing utterances

Ensure you don't unintentionally skew results

- If one intent consistently uses "please" that can skew results if the user says "please"
- Use a representative set of entity values, but not all
 - "John Smith", "\$20", "1st January" as example entity values

Keep the number of utterances balanced between intents

• e.g. avoid 300 for one intent and 15 for another

Test, test and test


• Ensure you are running batch tests to prove new utterances don't introduce failure


Best practices for designing utterances


The model is smarter than you think

Beyond the utterances themselves, the model has additional "intelligence"

- It "understands" the sentence and not just the individual words
 - "Balance my check" != "check my balance"
- The model generates variations of utterances behind the scenes and is pre-trained with a general knowledge of English
 - Give it "Audi", "BMW", "VW", it may then resolve "Mercedes"
 - Give it "Taxi", "Uber", Lyft", it may then resolve "Cab"
- But you need to give it enough hints about the context of words
 - Bank can have several meanings.
 - If the meaning is the financial institution, make sure to use variations in the utterances to clearly represent it, and not a park bank or river bank.

The following are real examples although the data has been changed to hide the original use case

formulaic

This is an intent for ordering pizza

- Whilst there might be 100 utterances like this
 - Very little linguistic variance
 - Too formulaic
- Overfitting the model
 - Will struggle to handle the variance in user input
 - Puts a strong signal on the sentence structure
 - "I want" becomes the strong signal

I want a large pepperoni pizza

I want a small pepperoni pizza

I want a large veggie pizza

I want a small veggie pizza

I want a large BBQ pizza

I want a small BBQ pizza



"big bucket"

This is an intent for a travel agent

- "Big bucket intent"
 - Utterances are related in use case but have little linguistic relationship
 - Uses entities to try and "understand" the different types of request
 - Model has to generalize over terms which are linguistically unrelated
- Signal for this intent is mixed and difficult to generalize





"polluted" utterances

This is an intent for checking stock

- Lifted directly from existing customer communication logs
 - So customer/developer thought they were following a good practice
- Do you really think this is representative of the intent?
 - Maybe this is what a customer might say but that isn't helping the model
 - Model is going to try and generalize a stock request based on phrase about
 - Being a member of the loyalty scheme
 - Moving into a new house
 - Views of the national park

Hello. I am a new member of your loyalty scheme. I was hoping to order a new fridge for my new house. We are moving in this Friday, its a lovely place just outside downtown with views of the national park. However my card took a while to arrive and when it did I missed it in the mail at first so I've only just received it. But when I look on your website it looks like the product is out of stock. You got any idea when this is going to be back in stock?

wrong "signal" in utterances

This is an intent to check the stock levels of kitchen goods

- Utterances heavily focused on the product, not the action/verb of the intent
 - The focus on this intent should be
 - "Do you have in stock.."
 - "What is the availability of.."
 - "I want to check if you've got..."
- The intent is now resolved with only the mention of a type of washing machine
 - "How much is the Samsung Series 5 ecobubble"
 - "The Hoover H-Wash fell on my head"
- As a "generalization" this intent is <u>anything</u> about kitchen goods
 - It <u>should</u> be about checking stock level



non complete/grammar

This is an intent for ordering items

- There is no concept of placeholder/parameters in ODA utterances
 - While the entity values might not be known, you have to have something which is broadly representative
- The model is now skewed to understand the string
 - <placeholder>

Approaches for creating utterances

Manual Creation

Quick to get started

Easier to apply best practices

Can be biased by a single developer

Data Manufacturing

Crowdsource utterances

Depends on quality of job and crowd

Requires more effort and time

Automated Generation

Not recommended for intents

ODA already does this behind the scenes

Too formulaic and over fitted
